Long-term Closure

Eastbound Ocean Blvd to Northbound I-710 Connector Ramp

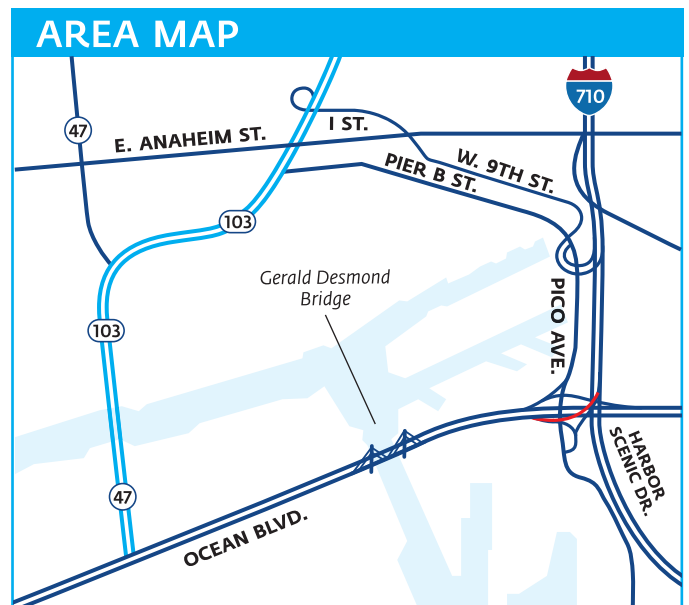
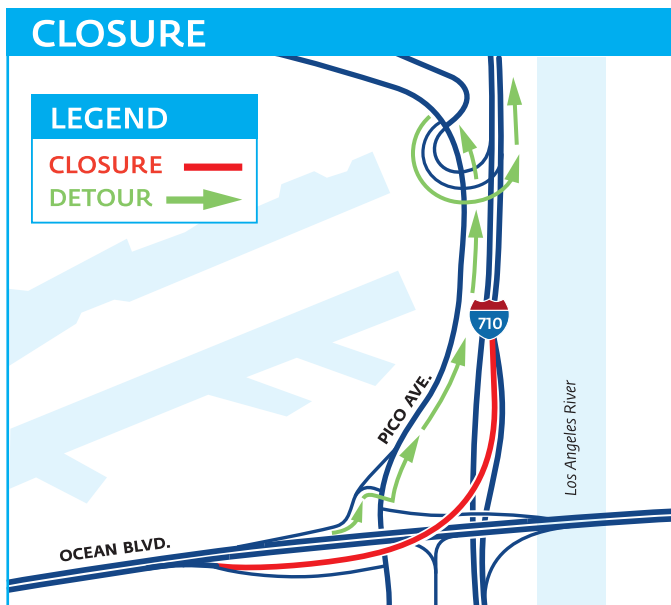
Start Date: June 11, 2018

Duration: 12 months*

CLOSURE: The connector ramp from eastbound Ocean Boulevard to northbound I-710 will be closed permanently on June 11, 2018. The ramp will be demolished as part of the Gerald Desmond Bridge Replacement Project to enable the construction of a new ramp, which is expected to be completed in mid-2019.

DETOUR: Traffic traveling on eastbound Ocean Boulevard that is headed to the northbound I-710 will be diverted briefly onto surface streets. Motorists will exit onto northbound Pico Avenue and will drive for approximately one-half mile to the on-ramp to I-710 at Pico and Pier B/9th Street and other northbound destinations. Detour signs will be posted.

Traffic headed east into downtown Long Beach will continue to use the current southbound Pico Avenue exit.
